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
The Scope of Contemporaneity:

Architecture in-between the Prospect of Postproduction and the Space of Exhibition

The state of architecture being exhibited and (re)exposed through formats of public display does not present the primary framework or medium of architectural production. Therefore, exhibiting architecture creates a specific form/site of displacement for architecture in which a multifaceted set of meanings and knowledge about architecture as discipline is provoked, forming the platform for re-questioning the relationship between the reference and contemporaneity of architecture.

One of the central and historically most prominent sites for observing the architectural fluctuations through the format of exhibition is the Venice Biennale of Architecture (founded in 1980). This international manifestation aims at continuous regeneration of the competence of discipline through exposing it against the current cultural, socio-economical, and geo-political backgrounds, where the diverse interests of architecture are being reflected, interlinked and revealed. The Biennale as cyclical exhibition of current architectural production and projections, operates within a specific temporality where architectural contemporaneity manifests itself as qualitative evidence of uninterrupted reconstitution and re-actualization of architectural discipline. This temporal specificity exposes architecture to its contemporaneity. In relation to this, the Biennale exhibitions are taking architecture as a set of the relatively stable conventions, theories, and canonized knowledge of practice (here the discipline functions as a reference) that should be exceeded and updated through the postproduction of architecture).

Taking the example of the Venice Biennale of Architecture as a case study, this paper aims to examine how the specific temporal form of exhibition relates the architectural discipline to the aspiration of always striving actuality. The main focus is put on the question how this biannually repeated interplay between reference and the form of exhibition makes architectural contemporaneity occur.
